Welcome to a new year of exciting, educational, and empowering times with Zeta Tau! The Executive Board met twice this summer planning our upcoming year, and we hope to have met your wishes expressed both at our April meeting and in the end-of-year survey.

You wanted to go back to working with one school this year. To that end, Terrie and I met with the principal, Rachel Martinez, and the CIS person, Yesenia Zapata Briones, at Spring Shadows Elementary (SSE) on August 21. (SSE was chosen because it was on the list of failing elementary schools posted in the Chronicle earlier this year.) Both were exceedingly pleased that we were offering our help. Terrie and I will be introduced at a faculty meeting on August 28 along with other community partners. We will hand out flyers about Zeta Tau along with candy. Then for our October meeting we will meet at SSE and hear from the principal.

Here are some ways we will* or can help SSE:

- *Dictionary program, established by SBISD to get a dictionary in the hands of every 3rd grader. We will pay for the dictionaries this year, and I will lead the ceremony on September 6 to hand them out. If anyone else would like to attend,
- please let me know.
 Book fair-September 16 to 21 during the day and September 19, 4-7p.m., (an opportunity for active teachers to take part). We need volunteers to sit with the books and help kids select a book.
- Volunteer as readers in grades 1-3 twice a month as SSE is now part of the Bush Literacy Program.
- Volunteer in the library as they only have a substitute teacher in the librarian position right now.
- *Collect school supplies for 2nd semester and fill a bag for each classroom teacher. Give to teachers in December.
- *Collect new or gently used books for a giveaway to students in December. Can be in English or Spanish, especially grades K-2
- *Goody bags for faculty in October. Other gifts of appreciation during the year.

If you look at the calendar, one other change you'll see is that there is no auction listed. Most people think it's time, whether live or silent, has come and gone. Therefore, we've come up with another way to earn money which will be explained at the first meeting. With our plans to help SSE, we will need that money as just the dictionaries will cost about \$350. To that end, if any of you would like to make an extra donation to cover a few dictionaries (\$5 each) or just because, we definitely would appreciate that. Just send the donation to Julie or bring to the first meeting. Check made out to Zeta Tau.

I spent part of last evening reading the latest Collegial Challenge. Lots of good articles. (I especially liked the one about the possibility of changing the name, but then again I know I differ from many of you on that topic!) Congratulations Zeta Tau on being recognized as a Spring Branch Good Neighbor for the 2018-2019 school year!

Spotlight on a DKG Founder: Annie Webb Blanton 1870-1945

Did you know? In 1916, Annie Webb Blanton was the first woman to be elected president of the Texas State Teachers As-

sociation. While in office she was able to establish a fund for financing campaigns for securing more support for public schools. Her success as president led teachers to encourage her in a bid for State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Her candidacy was from DKG website sponsored by the Texas State

Women Suffrage Association. In 1918, supported by the State Department of Education and numerous civic organizations, educators and legislators, she was the first woman elected to a public office in Texas.
